





Montacue Roosevelt Adams, well-known here through years of teaching in the Boyle County schools, association with the Presbyterian Church and other activities, died Tuesday at 4:30 p. m. at Ephraim McDowell Memorial Hospital. He was 79.

He was born in Danville on Feb. 10, 1893 to the late Mr. and Mrs. James T. Adams and received his early education at Bate School. He graduated from Knoxville College in Knoxville, Tenn., and did graduate work at Butler University in Indianapolis before returning here to teach in Boyle County schools. He later returned to Knoxville College where he also taught.

Commissioned by former Gov. Louie B. Nunn as a Kentucky Colonel in 1969, he was an active member of The Presbyterian Church where he served as an elder, a member of the Senior Choir and other departments.

He was also a member of the Masonic Lodge No. 18 F. and A. M. and a charter member of the board of visitors for Kentucky State Hospital. He was a veteran of World War I.

In addition to his teaching background, he was a retired cabinet maker and antique refinisher and rug cleaner at the Danville Laundry.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Agnes L. Adams; four sisters, Mrs. Ida Pope, Indianapolis; Mrs. Pearl Richardson, Bay City, Mich.; Mrs. Ola Cleage, Detroit; and Miss Florence Adams, Atlanta; three nieces, eight nephews, other relatives and a host of friends.


Raymond was also the father of Debbie Bush and Nelsonya Helm. Two other children, Ronald Barnes and Judy Carter, preceded him in death.

**Helen Fisher Frye** was the widow of John Goodwin Frye and the daughter of the late George and Lettie Moran Fisher. She was preceded in death by her twin brother Matthew and seven other brothers and sisters. Mrs. Frye or Miss Fisher as she was affectionately known attended Bate School and graduated in 1938 as Valedictorian of her class. She was a very active student playing basketball and involved in other school activities. She went on to pursue further educational endeavors including graduating from Kentucky State College (University) and receiving Masters Degrees from Indiana University and the University of Kentucky. She was also the first African-American to take a class at Centre College in the 1960s.

Mrs. Frye returned home after graduating college and taught in the Lincoln and Casey County Schools before being hired at Bate for close to 40 years. She started out as a P.E. teacher, 6th grade teacher and finally as librarian of the old Bate school and beginning librarian at the new Bate Middle School before retiring.

Mrs Frye wore other hats besides those in education. She has been active in First Baptist Church for more than 80 years. She was a Sunday School teacher, Superintendent of Sunday School, Missionary leader, church treasurer, Girl's Scout leader and mentor to a lot of people. She was also a Civil Rights Activist back when it was very dangerous during the 60's and 70's. She reorganized the NAACP and included young people being involved in sit-ins and the movement towards integration in Danville and the state of Kentucky. She and Mr. John were instrumental in helping establish the Willis Russell Historical Society. Mrs. Frye was also a member of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority.

Mrs. Frye married John Frye when she was 57 years old and they shared more than 25 years until his death about 6 years ago at the ripe young age of 104 years. Both loved to drive and would take off and go anywhere they wanted, especially Evenston, Illinois where his son and daughter lived. They would also attend all of the social functions at Centre College and enjoyed being a part of the Brass Band Festival.

Her goals were to help the Negro better himself and herself for the betterment of the community.

# MAJOR TIMOTHY E. WILSON



Moody E Wilson is a 1997 graduate of The Ohio State University with a Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Political Science. Major Wilson became a Marine warrior when he stepped onto the yellow sand at Parris Island, SC on 08 August 1989.

During boot camp, Private First Class Wilson went to Camp Pendleton Marine Corps Base (MCB) Camp LeJeune, NC for Marine training and then to Naval Air Station (NAS) Millington, TN "A" school where he was promoted to Lance Corporal (LCpl). He was then transferred to Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron (MALS) Yuma, AZ for duty as an Avionics Technician, MOS 6468. There, he participated in several Combined Arms Exercises. After his tour in station, he deployed with MALS-13 to Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) Iwakuni, Japan for a nine-month tour.

Stationed in Iwakuni, Japan, he applied for the Broadened Opportunity for Officer Selection and Training (BOOST) program. He completed and transferred to Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego, CA and completed the year-long course from 19 April 1992 to 09 April 1993. Upon completion of the course, he was promoted to Corporal (Cpl).

Upon completion of BOOST, Cpl Wilson earned a full academic Naval Officers Training Corps scholarship to attend The Ohio State University in Columbus, OH. He completed Officer's Candidate School at Quantico, VA in 1996. Upon receiving his BA on 13 June 1997, he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant. He was then ordered to attend Training School (TBS) in Quantico, VA. Upon graduation of TBS, he was assigned to MCAS Pensacola, FL to become an Air Traffic Control (ATC) Technician (OS 7220).

He was then ordered to MCAS Cherry Point, NC and assumed the duties of Facility Watch Officer. After completing his initial ATC duties, he was sent as the Marine Air Traffic Control Mobile Team member with the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit Special Operations Command (MEU SOC) 27 December 1999 to 26 January 2001 and was promoted to First Lieutenant (1stLt).

Returning from the MEU, 1stLt Wilson reported back to Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron - Two (MACS-2) and worked as the Tactical Air Operations Center Operations Officer and Detachment Commander.

In 2001, he detached from MACS-2 and joined MACS-1 in Iwakuni, Japan where he performed the duties of Deputy Detachment Commander and Operations Officer from 27 July 2001 to 31 October

2001 and was promoted to Captain (Capt) on 01 July 2001. In November 2001, Capt Wilson assumed command of MACS-1, ATC Detachment Bravo (Det B). He participated in several exercises and deployments to prepare the detachment for its deployment in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom. During this period, Capt Wilson earned the distinction as Weapons and Tactics Instructor from Marine Aviation Weapons and Tactics Squadron One at MCAS Yuma, AZ. Capt Wilson relinquished command of MACS-1, ATC Det B on 31 July 2003.

In September 2003, Capt Wilson reported to NAS Pensacola, FL and assumed duties as a Marine Liaison Officer for Aviation Maintenance Squadron Two, Marine Aviation Training Support Group Twenty-One. During this time, he also served as the Training Officer for the Marine ATC Maintenance School. In September 2006, Capt Wilson was transferred to Joint Reserve Base Fort Worth, TX where he served as the Detachment Officer in Charge (OIC) and Site Commander for MACS-24, ATC Detachment Alpha. On 1 October 2007, Capt Wilson was promoted to Major (Maj).

In August 2009, Maj Wilson departed for Okinawa, Japan to serve as the Tactical Air Command Center OIC for Marine Tactical Air Command Squadron Eighteen. After a nine-month tour, he returned to Fort Worth, TX and in June 2010, Maj Wilson moved to MCB Quantico, VA to serve as the Marine Air Command and Control Systems Analyst for Training and Education Command. He also served as the Contracting Officer's Representative. In March 2013, Maj Wilson received orders to his final command, Wounded Warrior Battalion East, where he was a patient at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center.

Maj Wilson's personal awards include: the Navy / Marine Corps Commendation Medal (Gold Star in lieu of second award), the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (Gold Star in lieu of second award), the National Defense Medal, and a Good Conduct Medal.

On a personal note, Maj Wilson was happily married to his beautiful wife, Kimberly. They were a strong and loving couple for 21 years. They had more than their fair share of trials and tribulations, including losing both of their fathers (his to cancer, hers to a motorcycle accident), losing 5 children to miscarriage and one to premature delivery, her diagnosis with lupus, and his second battle with cancer, but through their faith in God, their love for and commitment to one another, and the love of family, they persevered.
