A Life of Service



Throughout his life, Arthur Dunn was known for his kindness and generosity—to family, church, community and country.

Lessons learned in war, he said, helped make him the man we all knew and loved. Even though he rarely talked about the war—never about specific battles — he once said that having seen the worst of mankind didn't make him bitter. It instead made him want to be a better man.

In the spring of 1944, Arthur Louis left the family farm to voluntarily join the U.S. Army. He was assigned to the 5th Army, and the 92nd Infantry Division, one of two all-Black divisions formed during World War II.

The Buffalo Patch on his uniform distinguishes him as a member of the Buffalo Soldiers, a name given by Native Americans to Blacks because of their tight, curly hair. The name became a badge of honor because Native Americans held the buffalo in such high esteem.

As a member of the 5th Army led by Lt. Colonel Mark Clark, Staff Sgt Dunn was active in the 1944 campaigns—along with the 8th Army—that pried the Germans loose and began their eventual fall.

s a communications technician, Staff Sgt. Dunn's job was to travel ahead of his unit— often into enemy territory— to lay telecommunications lines.


As Staff Sgt, he earned the same pay (\$96) as his white counterparts, but he did not have similar authority to give orders.

When he returned to Lancaster, and discovered that returning Black veterans were being excluded from educational benefits offered white soldiers under the G.I. Bill of Rights, he found a teacher, and lobbied successfully for the first farming classes ever offered to Blacks in Garrard County. He was among the first to complete the five year course.





ary Geraldine Brown Dunn, 97, of Lancaster, died Monday, October 29, 2018, in Danville. She was born on March 27, 1921 in Beckley, West Virginia to Bee and Hester Ferguson Brown, a coal miner/ farmer and an elementary school teacher who taught her to love books and revere education.

From her father, she learned style. Like him, she dressed impeccably, always wearing her signature—a bold, designer scarf.

After Mrs. Dunn graduated from Stratton High School in Beckley in 1942, she

entered West Virginia State College where she began studies to become a teacher. But in the midst of World War II, in 1944, she met and married Army Sgt. Arthur Dunn, Jr. As was the custom, she awaited his return from overseas with his parents on Boone's Creek Road in Lancaster where she's lived ever since.

Mrs. Dunn was a lifelong learner, something she said she got from her mother. From her father, she learned to be outspoken and confident in her convictions. From them both, she learned to always demand justice. Over the years, Mrs. Dunn fought many battles within her rural community to improve conditions for



African Americans and anyone else she saw having a hard time.



ne of her earliest victories had to do with public school bus routes. When integration came in 1964, the local school board refused to reroute the buses to accommodate African Americans children who were walking miles.

She took her concerns to the Kentucky School Board Association, and the bus routes changed. Afterward, Mrs. Dunn remained active in the schools, becoming the first African American treasurer of the PTA at Camp Dick Robinson School where her daughter was among the first integrated first grade class.

In addition to serving as a founding member of the First Baptist Church Peace Walk Committee, annual sponsor of the Martin L. King. Jr. Peace Walk of Garrard County, Mrs. Dunn was also a founding member of the Garrard County Fair Board.

For nearly a quarter of a century, Mrs. Dunn wrote a column for the community newspaper, the Garrard Central Record. Upbeat and positive, Mrs. Dunn's column delivered the good news of Garrard County, especially the successes of her daughter and grandkids. An avid reader herself, she often included the phrase, "Reading is your ticket to freedom." As a longtime member of the Homemaker's Club, she frequently shared gardening tips and recipes. Just last year, four of Mrs. Dunn's most popular recipes, including her famous macaroni and cheese, ,were featured in the paper's "Recipe Corner."



woman of quiet and abiding faith, Mrs. Dunn was active in church since childhood, and, most recently, a faithful member of First Baptist Church of Danville.






