Obituary

Reverend A. C. Goodloe was born in Perryville, Kentucky, October 27, 1893. He was the second of five children born to Alice B. and Squire Goodloe.

His early education began in the one-room school of his home town. Later he attended Kentucky Normal and Industrial Institute (now Kentucky State University) and Simmons University.

Reverend Goodloe had a photostatic memory upon which he relied more than getting knowledge in the usual manner. This talent he often said had its advantages and its drawbacks.

His son, William Eugene Goodloe, preceded him in death in April, 1980.

His beloved wife, Lena Robinson Goodloe, preceded him in death in September, 1984.

Reverend Goodloe died at his home on Estill Avenue Saturday morning following a brief illness. He was 93.

Goodloe served as pastor of the First Baptist Church on Francis Street in Richmond, Kentucky for 26 years from 1955 until 1981 and was presently serving as Pastor Emeritus.

He chose to be called "The Old Republican" as he cherished his

affiliation with the Republican Party.

Some of his activities and accomplishments include pastorates at Springfield, Perryville, Goodloe's Chapel (Madison County), Crab Orchard and Logantown in Kentucky. He has been cited many times by the White House, by various Kentucky governors, by city officials of Richmond and others for his community work and service to humanity. He has also been recognized by presidents of Eastern Kentucky University for his service.

For more than 40 years, Rev. Goodloe served the General Association of Baptists in Kentucky as a member of the State Mission Board. He has also served on the Foreign Mission Board of the National Baptist Convention of America.

Survivors include a grandson, William Andrew Gcodloe, of Madison County; a granddaughter, Edna Elizabeth Goodloe of Richmond; a sister, Elizabeth Goodloe Pollard of Columbia, Maryland; three great-grandchildren; three devoted friends, Rev. Robert R. Blythe, Miss Cynthia Miller, and Miss Carol L. Mundy; several other relatives and friends of this and surrounding communities of this Commonwealth and this nation.


POEM
