Dr. Hill later united in fellowship with First Trinity Missionary Baptist Church in Jeffersonville, Indiana, where he continued to blossom in his faith under the mentorship of Rev. Walter Jimison. He was called to the ministry of Jesus Christ in 1957.

Dr. Hill greatly valued education. He was educated in the Clark County public school system, graduating from Jeffersonville High School. He began his undergraduate education at Indiana University, and ultimately earned a Bachelor of Theology from Simmons Bible College (now Simmons College of Kentucky) in 1962 and a Bachelor of Arts in History and Sociology from Cumberland College (now University of the Cumberlands) in 1971. He later matriculated to Union College in Barbourville, Kentucky, earning a Masters of Education in 1974. Dr. Hill received an honorary Doctorate of Divinity from Simmons Bible College in 1987.

In 1962, Dr. Hill was called to the Mill Street Baptist Church in London, Kentucky, where he served as pastor for twelve years. In 1974, he was called to pastor First Baptist Church, Danville,

Kentucky. During his tenure at First Baptist Danville, Dr. Hill baptized over 900 converts, ordained three ministers and ten deacons, and licensed three ministers. For thirty-one years, he faithfully served the members of First Baptist and the community of Danville until his retirement in 2005.

Dr. Hill was a beloved teacher, mentor and friend. During his five decades in ministry, he served on numerous boards, including the Board of Trustees of Simmons College, and as the President of the Baptist Unified Christian Leadership Conference. Dr. Hill's greatest passion, however, remained preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ and introducing and converting lost souls to Christianity. He fondly recalled and counted among his most significant life experiences a ten day revival he conducted in Panama, where over 1,000 souls were saved.

A devoted family man, Dr. Hill's greatest earthly treasures were his wife, children, and grandchildren. He relished spending time and sharing with them his love of books, westerns, model trains, and University of Louisville basketball. Dr. Hill was preceded in death by his parents and a sister, Alma Louise Hill Baines. He leaves to cherish his memory, his doting and devoted wife of 56 years, Mary Edith Ross Hill; a daughter, Dana Lynn Hill (George) Yeast of Danville, KY; two sons, Richard Eugene Hill, Jr. of Lexington, KY, and David Leroy Hill of Danville, KY; thirteen grandchildren, sixteen great-grandchildren and a host of sisters-in-law, brothers-in-law, nieces, nephews and cousins.

OBITUARY

Booker Talifero Holmes, the last of ten children of William H. and Amanda Holmes, was born October 12, 1905, in Dunnsville, Virginia. Early in his life, he committed himself to a life of spiritual service and joined the Angel Visit Church of Dunnsville, Virginia, to carry out the tenets of his faith.

He began his early education at Rappahannock Industrial Academy in Dunnsville, Virginia. In 1929, he received a Bachelor of Science degree from Virginia Union University, Richmond. The University of Michigan in Ann Arbor awarded him the Master of Science degree in 1936. After a few years as a classroom instructor, he entered Meharry Medical College, Nashville, Tennessee, where he earned the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree in 1947.

Dr. Holmes chose as his life-time companion Miss Helen E. Fairfax of Williamsport, Pennsylvania, whom he married March 26, 1932. Later, they became residents of Frankfort, Kentucky, where both served on the faculty of Kentucky State University - she as Head of the Department of English. Dr. Holmes practiced medicine in the local community thirty-four years until he retired in 1983 because of ill health.

In his organizational association, he was a Mason, holding membership in the Meridian Sun Lodge Number 26 and also the Grad Club of Frankfort, Kentucky. More permanently, he was a Life Member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), the National Medical and Kentucky Medical Societies. In recognition of his many years of humane patient care and professional service to the people of Kentucky, Governor Edward T. Breathitt commissioned him a Kentucky Colonel. The Kentucky Board of Medical Licensure on which he served from 1972 to 1984 also honored him "for dedicated service to the Commonwealth of Kentucky."

Dr. Holmes thoroughly diagnosed ailments, carefully prescribed curative remedies, and then gave constant bedside attention to preserve the health of his patients. His Bible-oriented college education was often reflected in his use of scriptures to explain his medical decisions: "That thou doest, do quickly," in John 13:27. He was an avid hunter, a staunch supporter of education, and a loyal follower of the physicians' Hippocratic Oath.

Survivors and mourners include Wife, Mrs. Helen F. Holmes, Frankfort, Kentucky. Nephews and nieces: Mr. and Mrs. Louis Kerr, Villanova, Pennsylvania; Mr. Francis Burnett, Morristown, New Jersey; Mrs. Gertrude Burrell, Claymond, Delaware. Cousins: Mrs. Marie Harrison and sisters, Dunnsville, Virginia. In-Laws: Mrs. Isabelle Austin and children, Grand Rapids, Michigan; Mrs. Esther Brown and son, Washington, D.C. Unlisted: Many relatives of the extended Holmes families; hundreds of doctors, nurses, and professional health-care workers; grateful patients and fraternal-club-lodge members; and local, state, and national beneficiaries of his life-saving services.

Mrs. Helen Fairfax Holmes, the eldest of three daughters of John W. and Isabella Fairfax, was born October 17, 1902 in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. She attended the public schools of Williamsport, graduating from high school in 1920 as an honor student and only member of her race in a class of two hundred. As a result of her impressive academic record, she was awarded a scholarship to Bucknell University in Lewisburg, Pa.

In 1924, she received a Bachelor of arts degree, graduating from the university with cum laude honors. At Columbia, University, New York City, she earned a Master of Arts degree at New York University.

On April 25, 1932, she was united in wedlock to the late Dr. B.T. Holmes of Dunnsville, Va., who later became a physician, practicing medicine for thirty-four years in Frankfort, Ky.

Mrs. Holmes devoted her talents an remarkable energy to education, religion, civic progress and social justice. Her teaching experience included Talladega College in Alabama, Delaware State College in Dover Delaware, Virginia University in Richmond Va. as well as its Norfolk Division. and Milwaukee Branch of the University of Wisconsin. At Kentucky State University, she taught for nearly thirty years (1943-1973), serving several years as head of the Department of English. Under her sponsorship, the college organization received campus applause and national praise. Many student regarded her as an intellectual parent. some of the affectionately referred to her as " Mother Holmes:.

Although she shared in various local church efforts, her membership was in St. John A.M.E. church which she supported generously.

During her years of vigor, she was an active citizen in the community where she was a tireless worker with the Frankfort cancer Society, she served twenty years with the Girl Scouts. Mrs. Holmes was a member of many local boards, one of which The Frankfort electric and Water Plant Board, presented an award to her for outstanding service, she was also a member of the Frankfort-Lexington Chapter Links Inc., Many persons on the University Campus and in the City of Frankfort, representing all ages and groups, regularly patronized her various cultural, recreational and educational bus trips to major events in nearby cities.

As a life member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), she was a prominent advocate, by voice and foot, for a society of human equality and racial justice. Her Greek sisterhood membership was in Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.. For her unselfish and distinguished contribution to Commonwealth of Kentucky, Governor Edward T. Breathitt made her a Kentucky Colonel.

Survivors three nieces: Isabella Treece, Dayton, Ohio, Esther Austin, Southfield, Michigan, and Gertrude Burrell , Claymond, Delaware, two nephews: William Brown, Southfield, Maryland and Francis Burnett, Moorestown, New Jersey, Special Friends Al and Marie Williams.

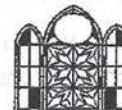

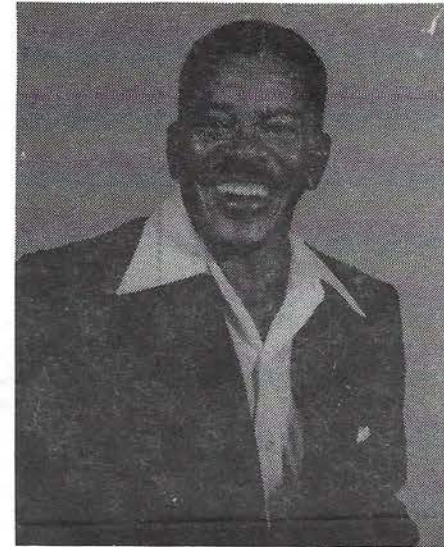

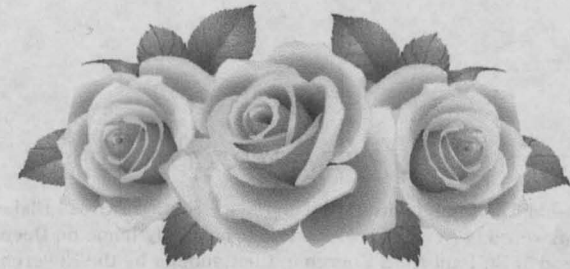

LIFE REFLECTIONS

Born to the Reverend Charles Edward Blake and Mary Beatrice Cross Blake, the Reverend Cheryl Hoskins answered her call peacefully to her heavenly home on December 31, 2013. Rev. Cheryl was baptized at St. Paul AME Church in Chattanooga by the Reverend Elmer Martin Sr. She received her elementary school education in the Hamilton School System in Chattanooga. The family moved to Danville, Kentucky and she attended middle school and high school at Bate High School and Danville High School, where she was a member of the marching band and graduated as a National Merit Scholar in 1965. She entered the University of Illinois in Urbana, and later transferred to Chicago State University where she became a member of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.

We were always happily surprised at Cheryl's fun loving spirit. One day she thought our mother was going to give her a spanking and her response was, "Let me pray first." We all fell out laughing. As she matured, just like we had been taught by our parents, Cheryl began to spread her wings, think independently, and moved beyond her comfort level and excelled in her God-given gifts. Cheryl was fun to be around and she was the "life of the party" because she was "real." Each day was exciting and we were always happily surprised at Cheryl's antics.

As a "PK" in the parsonage, Cheryl had her stories to tell. She had many friends and no one was a stranger. As youth, she was gifted in speaking and making people feel welcomed regardless of their status. At the age of 10, Cheryl gathered a few of her playmates and began her work of helping the elderly and children. Her first message in church was given at St. Paul AME Church in Alcoa, Tennessee, "Jonah and the Whale." As she continued to grow in grace and favor, Cheryl stayed involved in church youth ministries: YPD, Youth Choir, and Church School.

On July 19, 1969, she married Nathaniel Hoskins Jr. at St. James AME Church, Danville, KY. To that union, two daughters, Natisha and Mary were both born in Danville. Reverend Hoskins worked as director of programs with the Model Cities Program of Newport, KY, Community Links and Community Action and Service Agency of Cincinnati, Ohio until her health began to fail. Rev. Cheryl answered the call to preach and was ordained in the African Methodist Episcopal Church and became pastor of Wilson Chapel AME Church in Parksville. In 2010, she founded Blake Chapel AME Church in Newport, KY in memory of our father, the Reverend Charles E. Blake. At the time of her death, Rev. Hoskins served as a minister at St. James AME Church in Covington. She worked in evangelism and sung in the choir. Rev. Hoskins donated her "body to science" knowing others would benefit.
