



Admiral Joseph Jackson, 73, of Lexington, KY, went home to be with God on Friday, April 18, 2014, as a result of a brave battle with lung cancer. Born in Lexington, Kentucky on December 27, 1940, Joseph was the youngest child of the late Admiral Dewey and Rebecca Jackson.

Joseph demonstrated his brilliant curiosity and creativity at an early age. He enjoyed re-engineering and creating new from the old, using whatever tools and objects available to him. His family and friends marveled at his unique and often very useful creations. He was quite skillful at playing games, including baseball. He liked to watch movies and enjoyed dancing with his very sensitive feel of rhythm serving as an excellent substitute for his lack of hearing. He enjoyed the freedom to drive and explore the world by car, and was quite happy when he obtained his Kentucky Driver's License at age 16.

Joseph was baptized at an early age at Historic St. Paul A.M.E. Church by the late Rev. (Bishop) Harrison James Bryant. He remained a member of St. Paul until the Lord called him home. As he grew into a young man, Joseph did not let his physical challenge as a death mute hamper him in any way from his participation in the youth choir and many other activities at his church. He also enjoyed involvement in many community activities, including the North Upper Street YWCA, swimming at Douglas Park and frequent family outings. Most memorable are his first family trip to the Cincinnati Zoo, the Circus and the Lexington Airport (now Blue Grass Airport) to see his first airplanes.

Joseph entered the Kentucky School for the Deaf in Danville, Kentucky on December 28, 1947. At that time, like most schools in the United States, the deaf school was segregated – separate, but the educational offerings were definitely not equal to the deaf school for white students just across the street. This was quite unacceptable to Joseph's parents who wanted only the best for their youngest child with special needs. This led Joseph's father, Dewey Jackson, to work closely with United States and Kentucky elected officials and other leaders, and eventually integration of the "white" and "colored" deaf schools was achieved.

On May 25, 1961, with an "Honorable Testimonial of Excellence of Character and Faithful Application, Joseph graduated from the Vocational Department of the Kentucky School for the Deaf with a Certification in Tailoring. Later, he applied his vocation in his employment as a Tailor with Lexington men's clothier Graves & Cox Company and Sonny's Cleaners.

Joseph was loved by his family and friends in the community, many of whom have warm and humorous stories they are all too eager to share about their associations with him.

Joseph leaves to cherish his memories two sisters: Peggy Fowlkes (Nelson) of Dublin, California, and Bessie Jackson of Lexington; four nieces: Priscilla Sullivan (Marvin), Sandra Brooks and Paula Campbell of Lexington and Janet Billups of Palo Alto, California; two nephews: Errol Fowlkes (Babette) and Nelson Joseph Fowlkes (Tracey) of Fresno, California; a host of great nieces, great nephews, and cousins, including special cousin Mary Jo Black; and many friends, including special friends Julian Jackson, Arthur Lewis and Ronald Burruss. Preceding him in death was his brother, Jerry K. Devine, the first African American elected chair of the merged Fayette County School Board.

Goodbye my brother, my uncle, relative and friend. You will be sorely missed, but our love for you and the fond memories will remain in our hearts.
