Thomas W. Johnson was born in Brooksville, MS. He was the fourteenth child and youngest son (of sixteen children) born to Rev. Dewitt R. Johnson, Sr. and Lizzie Alice Gray Johnson who preceded him in death. Thomas received his high school diploma from Macon High School in the Noxubee County School District.
