



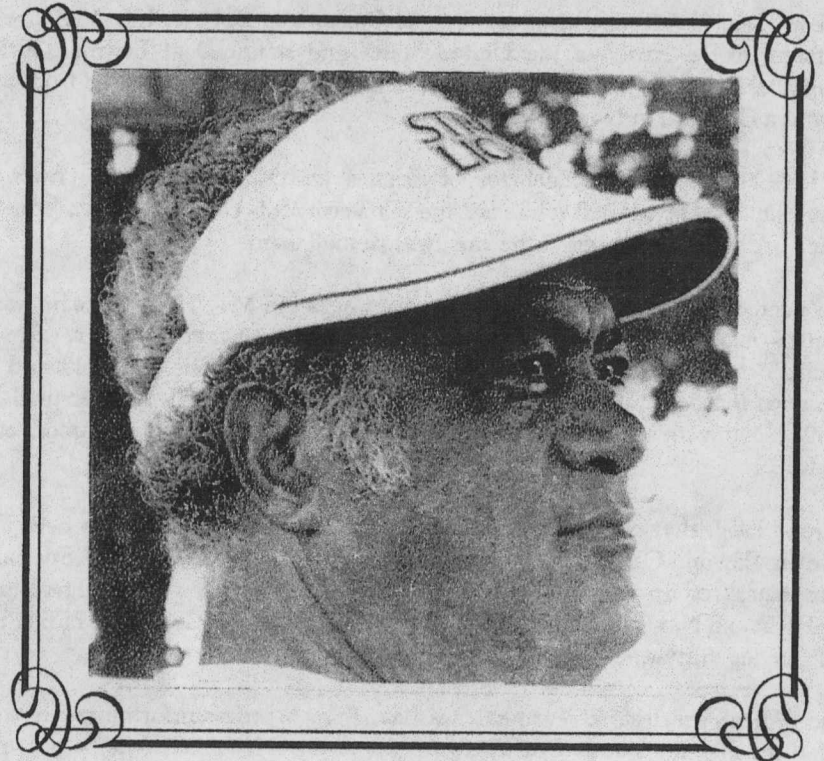

Obituary

Charles "Ben" Jones, Sr. departed this life on July 24, 2001. He was born in Danville, Kentucky to the late Charles T. Jones and Emma D. Jones on July 27, 1921. In December 1942, Ben married Martha Jean Biggs of Dayton, Ohio. They were blessed with two children, Linda Diane Combs and Charles B. Jones, Jr.

Ben received his childhood education in Cincinnati, OH. In July 1942, he was drafted into the Army of the United States and stationed at Bowman Field in Louisville, Kentucky from 1942 to 1945. He was honorably discharged from active duty as a Corporal in November 1945.

In 1949, he received a Bachelor of Science and Education degree from The University of Dayton. While at the University of Dayton, he was the first African-American member of the varsity basketball team.

Ben's career in the federal service as a civilian began in May 1949 where he was the business manager for professional heavyweight boxer Ezzard Charles. He met Ezzard, who was also known as "Snooks" when he was nine years old and they remained friends until Ezzard passed. Ben served as business manager until May 1950. During this time, Ezzard held the title of heavyweight champion of the world.

In June 1950, Ben continued his civilian career at the Wright Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton, Ohio as a program manager in the Directorate of Specialized Subsystems, responsible for the Management of Multi-Million Dollar Programs in the Flight and Navigation Instrumentation area. Ben retired at the age of fifty-three after serving thirty-one years as a civilian federal service employee.

One of Ben's greatest achievements was launching a program for inner-city youths called the Dayton Youth Golf Academy in 1989. He directed the program for many years and continued to be involved as a volunteer instructor giving free lessons to children two or three times a week. Over one thousand Dayton youngsters participated from the academy as well as benefited from Ben's patience, generosity, and encouragement.

Ben was a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Lambda Theta Chapter, and a member of Dayton Golf Hall of Fame. Through out his life, Ben was an avid golfer.

Ben leaves to treasure his memory and celebrate his life, his loving wife of 59 years, Martha Jean Jones; son & daughter-in-law, Charles B. Jr. & Charlena; daughter & son-in-law, Linda D. & Larry Combs; grandchildren, Efreem McAdoo, MD, Chad, Karmin & Sydney Jones; brother, Norman Jones; sisters, Euriel Mae Payne & Barbara Jones; brother-in-law, Fowler A. 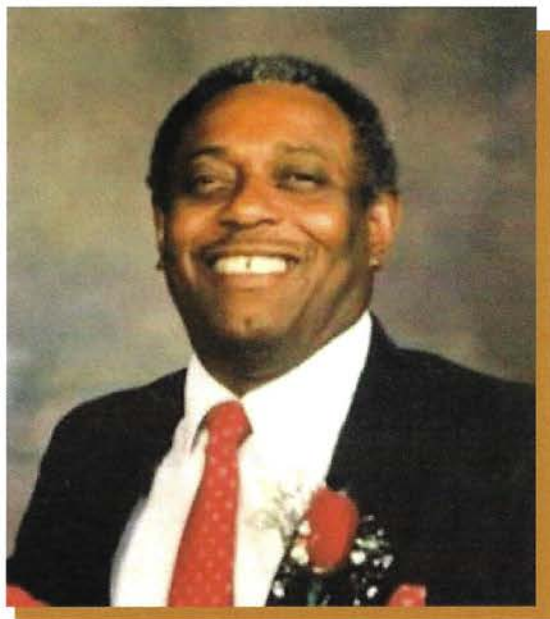

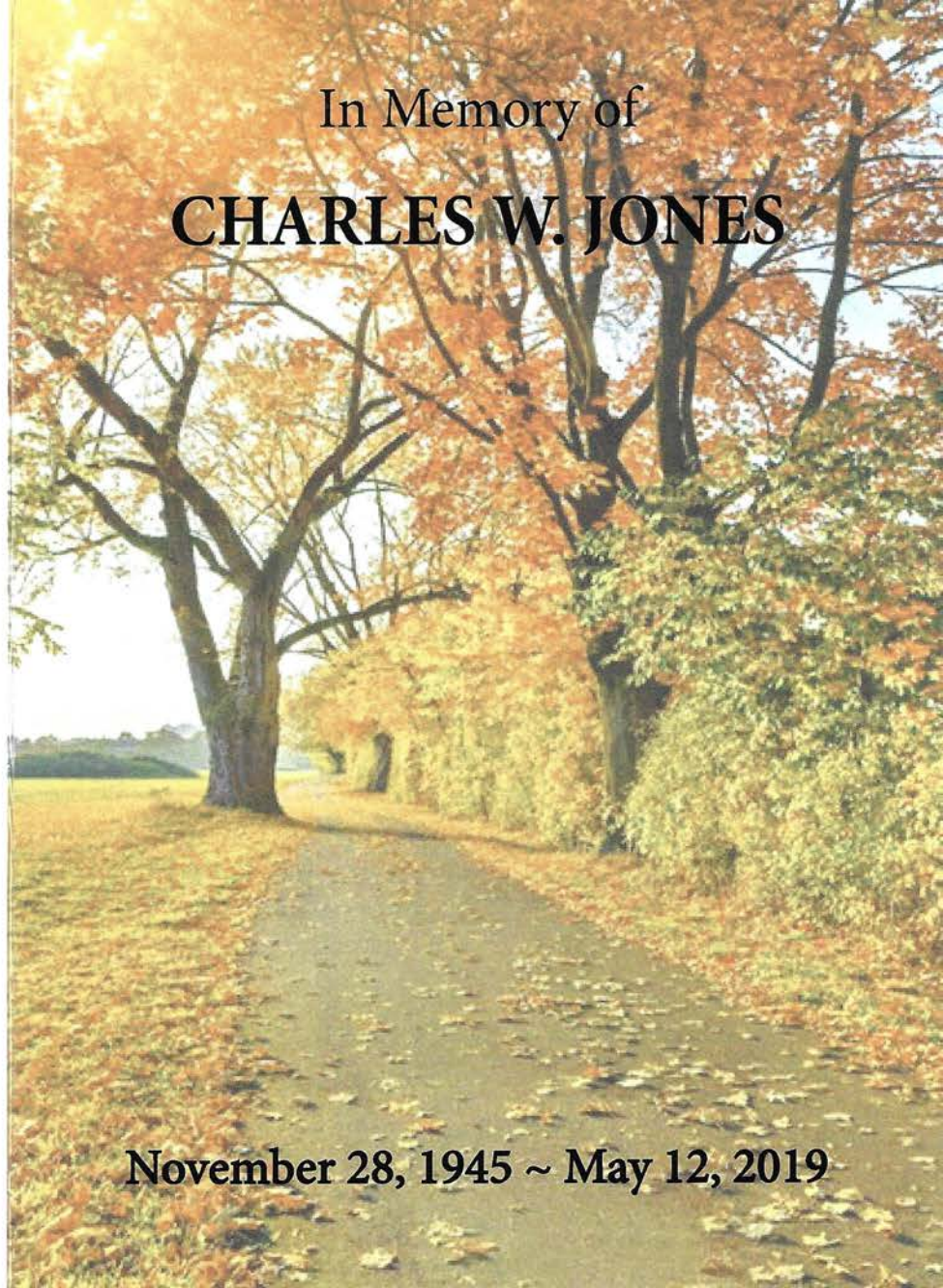

Charles graduated from Lincoln High. He retired from the Veteran Administration Medical Center in Lexington, KY after forty plus years of service.

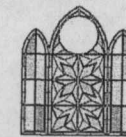

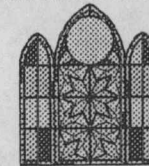

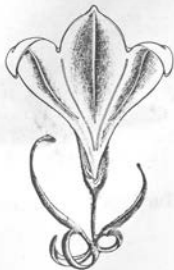

She was passionate about her writing, which inspired her to publish a book of r favorite poems she had written.

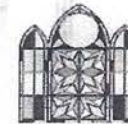

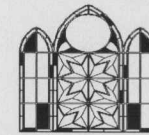

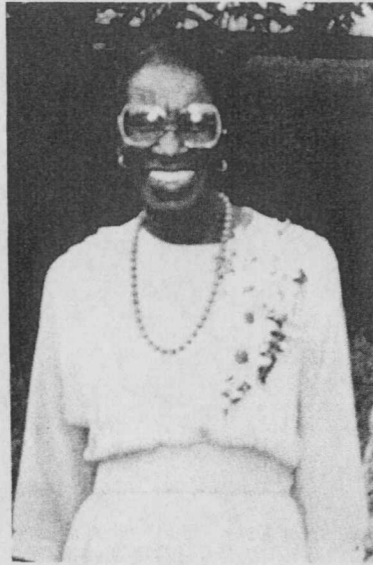

The Lord replied, "My precious, precious child, I love you and I would never leave you. During your times of trial and suffering, when you see only one set of footprints, it was then that I carried you."

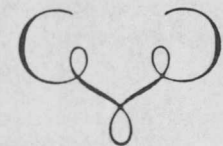
