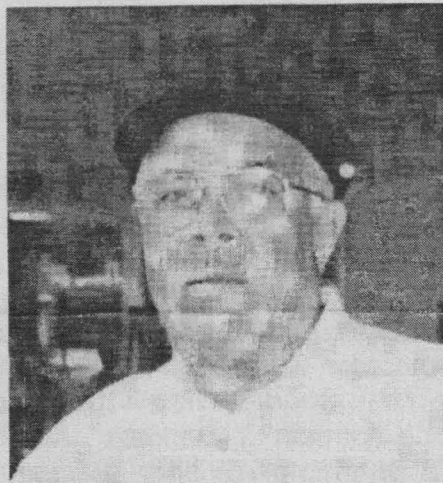

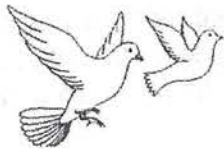

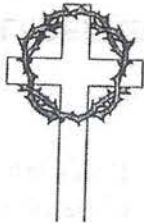
## THE OBITUARY

The following local choruses were some of many she had trained: Usher's Chorus of Evergreen Baptist Church, Keys of Zion, Zion Hill Baptist Church Choirs and the Emancipation Day Chorus.

Death came quietly on Tuesday, January 24th at 7:40 P.M. closing a busy life of 54 years, three months and seven days spent in the Master's service.

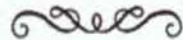

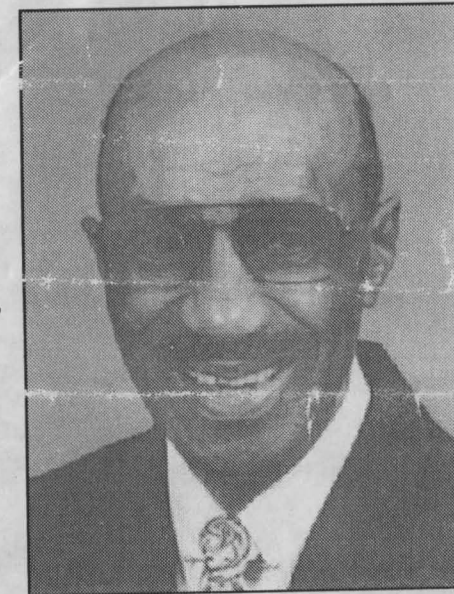

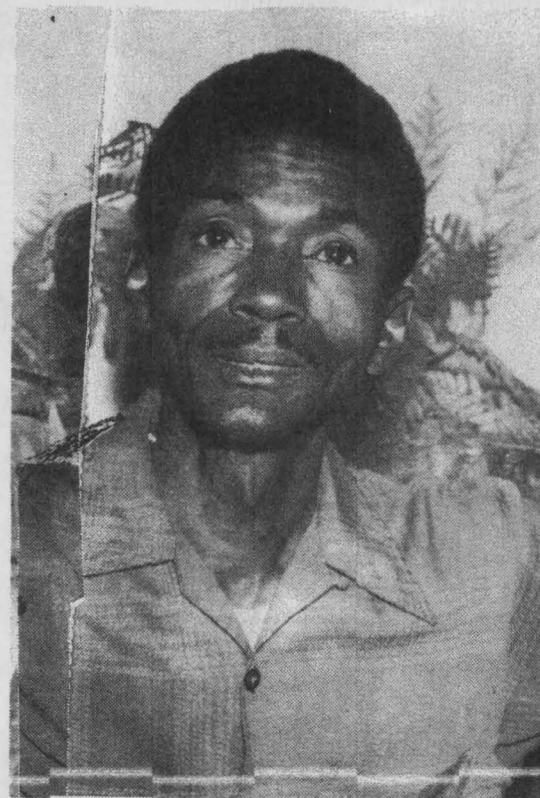
LOVELL KINLEY WAS BORN APRIL 19, 1919 IN DANVILLE, KENTUCKY,

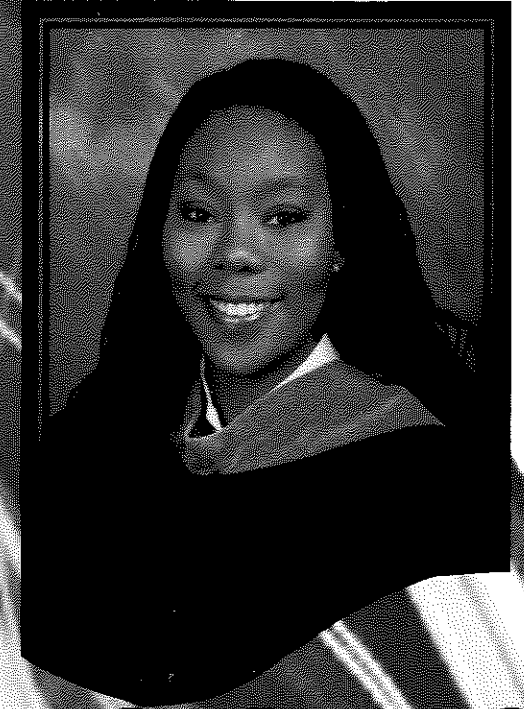

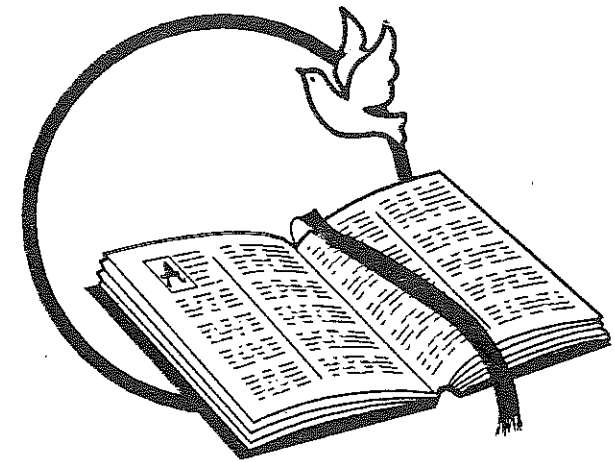

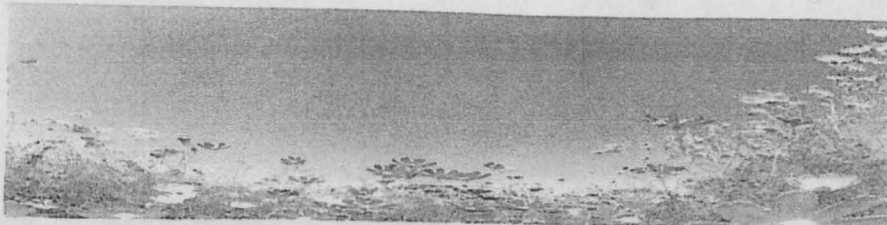
