QUESTION: Why did my mother have to die? She was such a wonderful person. I can't figure it out, and I can hardly stand it. Please tell me why good people have to die?

ANSWER: First, death is a penalty of sin. "The wages of sin is death," says the Bible. God never meant for man to die. However, when man rebelled against God - he began to die. "Thus it is appointed unto man once to die." There are many reasons for death.


Second, death is a friend to the aged. When the body begins to waste away, and the tortures of old age come upon our elders, they welcome death. He takes an aged Christian by the hand and gently leads them to a realm where there is no sorrow, death or pain.

Again, if there were no death, the old would get older and would dominate the race. Youth and newness would have no meaning. The world would be overpopulated so that the young could not grow food enough for those who were old. Death is the great population stabilizer.

Death, again, is a reminder of the brevity of time. The Psalmist said: "Teach us to number our days." Someone has pointed out that if our life-time is likened to a day beginning at 7:00 and ending at 11:00 at night, at fifteen years of age it would be 10:25 in the morning. If you are eighteen, it is 11 o'clock. If you are twenty-five it is 12:42 in the afternoon. "Teach us to number our days."
