Brother Jesse Edward Mason, known as "Mr. Jesse" was the only son of Clay and Beulah Mason. He was born in Jessamine County April 17, 1919 and exchanged this life for eternal life and a crown in Glory on April 30, 2002. He preceded in death by a son Mario Cretis and a daughter-in-law Lisa.

Mr. Jesse accepted Christ as his personal Savior at an early age and was a faithful and devoted member of the First Baptist Church, Nicholasville all of his life. He served as a Deacon, church clerk, church school superintendent and choir member.

He graduated from Rosenwald Dumbar High School and attended Kentucky State University

until drafted to serve in World War II in the United States Air Force.

Mr. Jesse married Eugenia Embray in 1947, and was blessed with five children from that marriage. Following Eugenia's death he was married to Nadine Jones for approximately thirty years who past in 1995.

On October 5, 1996, he was united in marriage to his loving and devoted wife Ruby McCoy of

Radcliff, KY.

Mr. Jesse loved his family, his church and his community. He was an encourager to everyone, especially the youth through his Christian walk, as a civil rights activist and as an entrepreneur. He was the first African American licensed Used Car Dealer in the state of Kentucky and operated a used car business for 32 years. He was also a licensed home construction contractor. He was a leader. He organized the first African American Little League Baseball club, the "Slugger Dodgers" in Jessamine County in 1958 prior to integration to provide guidance to young males in the community. The team was transported twice a week to Lexington to play competitively in the Lexington Recreation League. In 1965, he helped spearhead integration of the Jessamine County public schools which resulted in the closing of the African American high school, Rosenwald Dunbar. In the mid 90s he lead the community movement in convincing the city to name the newly constructed Jessamine Middle School Rosenwald Dunbar.

Mr. Jesse also served on the Nicholasville Housing Board, the Board of City Councilmen, was commissioned a

Kentucky Colonel and helped organize the first Rosenwald Dunbar Alumni Reunion.

His life touched the world. He was vice president of the Layman for the Consolidated District, a member of the Masonic Order for over 50 years and earned his 33 degree. As a member of the Order, he served as Past Master of Central Lodge #91, Past Grand Lecturer and the Honorary Grand Master for the Prince Hall Grand Lodge for the state of Kentucky, Past Commander-In-Chief for the Blue Grass Consistory and held numerous other positions in the Masonic Order serving the organization nationally and internationally.

Mr. Jesse was firm but fun, a joy to be around. He loved to fish as a sport and was also known as an avid fisherman to win souls for Christ. He was husband and father to be proud of, always sacrificing to break down racial barriers to ensure that his children and many others received the best educational and employment opportunities available. Mr. Jesse always left you laughing or left laughing at you. But, he was "old school" and while he encouraged, he also corrected those he loved by saying, "God's been too good, I want you to get yourself together".

Then he would stay on you to help you "tighten-up".
