The Almighty God in His infinite wisdom saw the suffering of His servant and whispered, "peace be thine", thus calling the Reverend Joseph Ronald McAdoo to his eternal reward on Wednesday, August 31, 2005 from his residence on Oak Hill Road after a 3 year illness. Born November 30, 1944, he was the son of Clementine Bogle Munday and the late Reverend Floyd Weaver Childs. He was united in marriage to Mary Duncan on June 16, 1973. He was a loving father of five children and a person who dearly loved his family.

Joseph was "saved" in 1961 at Holiness Church in Bogletown which now is called the Church of God of America, where he remained a faithful member until his death. He accepted the call to the ministry a few years later. He was very vocal and dedicated to the cause of Christ, taking every opportunity to make individuals think about whether or not they had a personal relationship with God and if not that they make it right before it was too late.

Joe was known throughout the state of Kentucky for his singing, piano playing and preaching. He was blessed to produce a CD along with his wife which was titled, "A Taste of Art". It was a big hit. He officiated numerous funerals. In the last year of his life, he would fondly say, "I don't have time to lay down and die for burying other people", and he would follow that by a big chuckle. He was also an avid antiquer. The older things were the better he liked them.

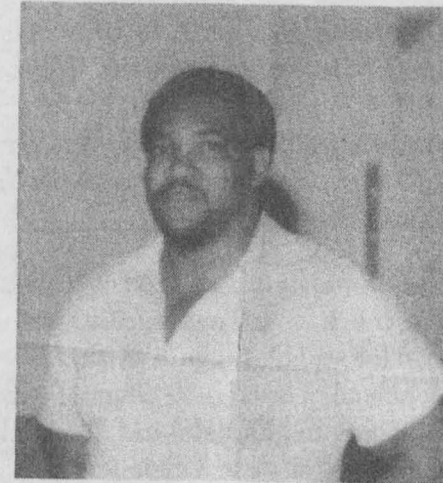

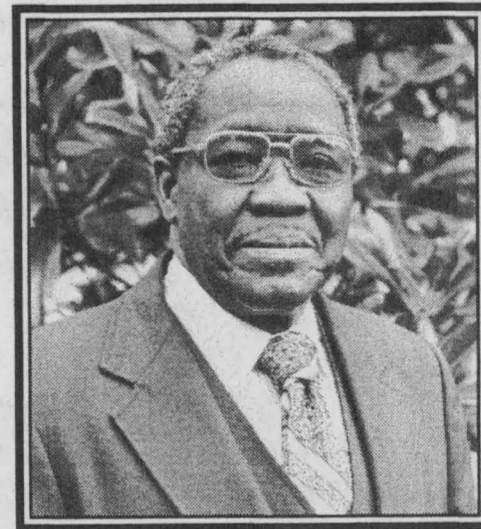

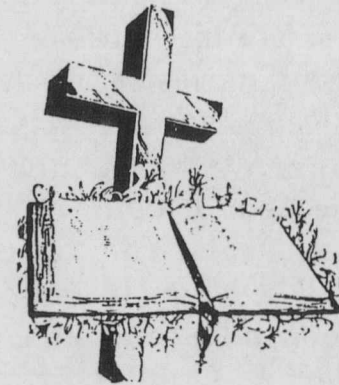

Reverend Givens Carter McCormack, age 52,

Rev. Dr. Leon Haley McIntyre was born on October 6, 1937 to the late Don Carlos, Sr. and Minnie L. (Greene) McIntyre in Georgetown, Kentucky.

Dr. McIntyre acknowledged his Call to the Gospel ministry in 1965 on the Island of Bermuda while serving in the Navy. He was the former pastor of First Baptist Georgetown for 10 years and the First African Baptist Church where he labored for 33 and a half years. He also served as Interim pastor at First Baptist, Danville, Kentucky for approximately one year.

He was truly a servant of Christ not looking for fame or accolades from others, lived his life as a teaching pastor/preacher, making disciples through the guidance of the Holy Spirit along his earthly journey. His daily prayer was to be used as His vessel and to establish his steps, and to direct his path. The Holy Spirit gifted him with multiple abilities as historian, writer, author, editor, biblical instructor, consultant, evangelist, church leadership support trainer, lecturer and counselor.

He loved the brethren and wanted them to experience the precious graces that he had been privileged to enjoy, with the great assurance that he was never alone.

Dr. McIntyre had an insatiable appetite for the Word. He would spend hours on end daily with the Lord meditating, studying, writing, worshipping and praying. His behavior and demeanor can only be depicted by the song "All Day Long, I've Been With Jesus."

Dr. McIntyre was very modest about his educational achievements, these are just a few of his accomplishments, he received the Bachelor of Arts Degree in Sociology and Black History from Kentucky State College, Frankfort, Kentucky. He received the Master of Divinity Degree in Pastoral Care and the Doctor of Ministry Degree from The Lexington Theological Seminary, Lexington, Kentucky. He was also conferred a Doctorate of Divinity from Simmons Bible College.

Dr. McIntyre has held many positions, as well as had opportunities to participate in associational work supporting district, state and national levels. He was the former Moderator and Vice Moderator of the Consolidated District Association; Instructor for the Consolidated District Laymen, the Managing Editor of "The American Baptist" newspaper. He also served and held positions of 3rd and 2nd Vice Moderator of the General Association. Dr. McIntyre was the founding elected Moderator of the Kentucky Missionary Baptist Association in 2008.

Dr. McIntyre was the discoverer of the history of the First African Baptist Church, West of the Allegheny Mountains. He was the developer and erector of the first worship home built by the 214 year old congregation, located at 465 Price Road.

Dr. McIntyre authored many works: "One Grain of the Salt," "Golden Series: Measuring Your Spiritual Growth," "Jesus and Words," "The Saint's Comforter," "Basic Baptist Doctrines Revisited," "My New Life," "Making Sense of Suffering," "Let's Get Together," "The Lord Supper," "At What Hour," "I Do," and "Shepherd and Sheep."

Dr. McIntyre had a great sense of humor always joked about wanting to sing in a choir without causing pain to the hearers. That desire would not come to fruition during his time on earth, but he's for sure anticipating singing tenor and lead in the Heavenly Choir, "Worthy Is The Lamb."

Journeying to his eternal home, he leaves to more his devoted and loving wife, Mary A. (Baker) McIntyre; his son, Licentiate Leon H. McIntyre, II; two brothers, Freddie McIntyre and Don (Mary) McIntyre; grandchildren, Imani, Juan Carlos, Christian, Kyla and Jailyn, who affectionately called him "Baby Dunkin;" god-daughter Haley Tinsley; two aunts, Katie Wilson and Mabel Garland; brothers-in-law, George "Buster" (Dottie) Baker, Charles "CK" (Patricia) Baker, and Yakub Odudele; sister-in-law, Margaret Robinson; special aunt, Estevior Baker; and a host of nieces, nephews and cousins.
