He leaves to mourn his passing a granddaughter Cheryl Rowe Moncure; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.

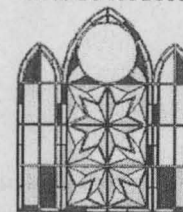


When the last scene of his life flashed before him,

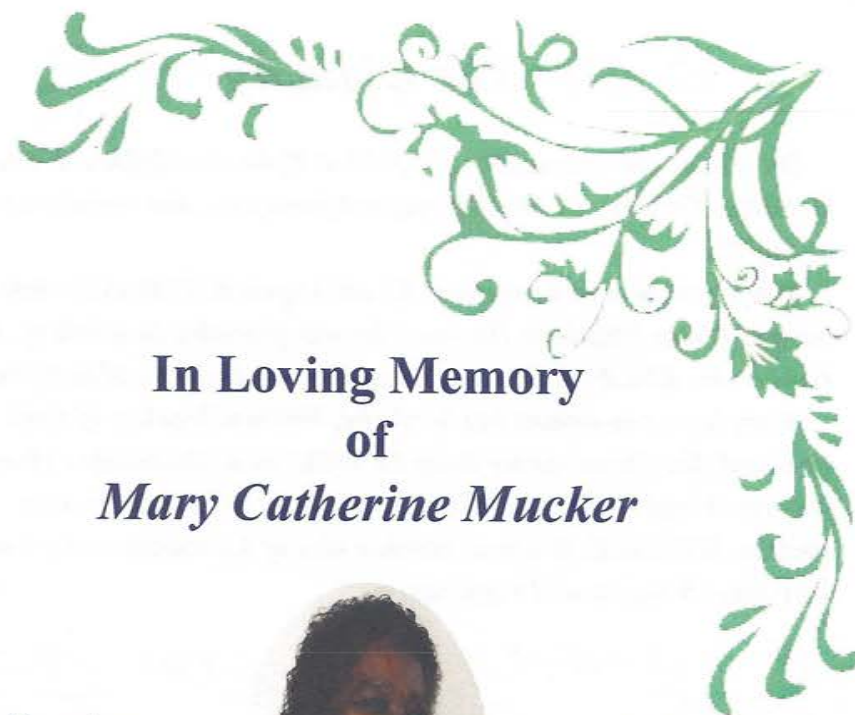

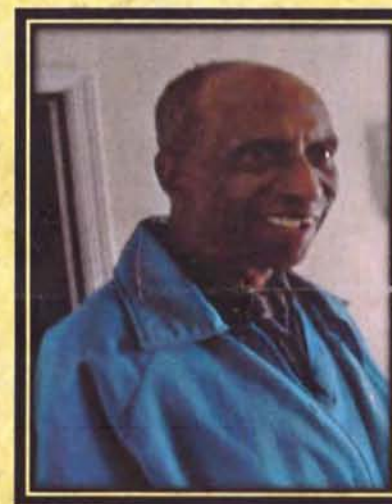

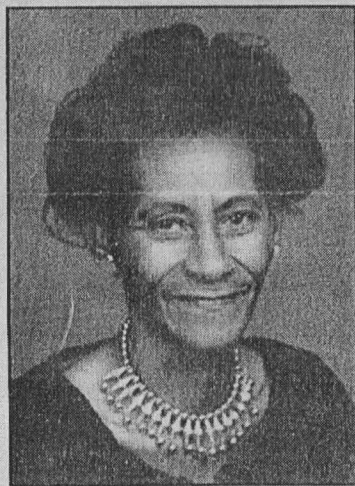
