REV. GENE RAYE THOMAS In his own words

"Good afternoon everyone! I guess I need to tell you a little bit about myself, since this is what is traditionally expected. Well, let's see, now let me remind you that my wife is writing this as I encouraged her to do so. Now, you know if I were there with you, I'd tell you myself, but right now I am so excited about seeing the Savior, I can hardly do this. If you've heard this before, just skip over it . . . you know how we do!

I, Gene Raye Thomas, was born on March 25, 1956 to the late James and Emma Thomas in Shelbyville, Kentucky, just down the road from Eminence, where I grew up. I don't know why they named me Gene Raye - everybody calls me that from home. They were good parents and provided well for us. There were six of us, Joan (Scott) Murphy - she's already passed. Y'all know she died at Momma's funeral. Now, I know they were close, but God, I didn't expect that! Then there's Betty, who lives in Louisville; Ralph (Debra) Reed; Michael "Mike" (Valerie) Thomas, they all stay in the country in Eminence; and my baby brother William (Teresa) Thomas, who lives in Maryland.

All of us kids would be eating dinner and Daddy would say, smacking his mouth, "Ya like that?" We'd say, "Yes sir!" Then he would reply, "Well, bring in something every now and then." There was a lot of love in the house. If I had time, I would tell you how Daddy made me, Ralph and Mike dig out our basement. William didn't have to do anything. The rest of us got the work and the whippings. I remember I got a whipping and Ralph felt so sorry for me that he brought me ice for my whelps. I tried to run away from home when I was five, but came back before it got dark.

I graduated from Eminence High School in 1974. I thought I might be an actor, but instead I went to West Kentucky Vocational School for two years to become a brick mason. Boy, I got home sick too! Momma and Daddy dropped me off and that was it. I went to my room with my luggage and a bag of orange slices candy. Shoot, after I graduated and came home, Daddy was on me to get a job, of course. Oh yeah, you gonna work. And ya gonna give up some money too if you were going to stay in Dynamite's (daddy's) house. He used to say, "Well, you can pay here or you can pay up town!"

We had to go to church too. I joined First Baptist Church, under the late Rev. W.H. Goatley. After I got married to my sweetheart, I moved my letter to New Mount Zion Baptist Church, where I became a Deacon and then accepted my call to ministry. I told Daddy I wanted to get married. He told me, "Boy, you better get you a better job before you marry that girl." I didn't mind working. I laid bricks when I could. I worked at General Electric which became Frankfort Plastics, Quebcor, Buffalo Trace, and Bendix until I became unable to. I had a good time working and met great friends, some I still talked to, like Ike Davis. Hey Ike, I hope I ain't too heavy.

I loved to fish, Grand Pap got me into that. It's just relaxing. Now don't get me wrong, I like some fish. Tammy, you remember when funds were low and the Lord blessed us with all them fish? Y'all, we ate fish for a week!

Well, speaking of Tamera, I thought she was the prettiest girl in Shelbyville (she doesn't like it when I say that). We've been married almost 38 years. The Lord blessed me with a beautiful daughter and handsome son. I can't express how much I appreciated y'all helping your Momma take care of me. Juan, you gave the best shower - the water was just right! I will sure miss our talks. I think the Cards are gonna get in the NCAA tournament next year. Juan, you and Ebone' take care of your Momma and each other. Stay close to God. Juan, you go on back to church - Daddy's alright now! Daddy loves all of you and I am going to miss you all. Brothers and my dear sister Bettye, I need all y'all to from this day forward to come together and love one another. Mike, you always did what I did. I went to Paducah, here you come; I got married; here you come. Then I get called to the ministry...who's next? You. When, I had to stop pastoring, instead of "Here's Johnny" it's "Heeeere's Mike!" I know you're busy taking care of God's people. Pleasantview are some of the best people in the world! Lastly, I need you to be there for my wife, you and Valerie just be there for my family. I would have gone home a long time ago, but I kept asking the Lord to let me stay for them. I love you brother. I love all of y'all. Every one of you out there reading this. I love you, I will miss you. I hope you can get here.

Well, I hear royal music and angels singing "Holy, Holy, Holy." No, Jesus I can't look up! Oh my God! Y'all should see this . . . it's so bright, wait a minute . . . I can see! I can see! I can see Him! Y'all, I can see Him . . . His face y'all. Oh, Lord, I just looked at my hands, my fingers, are all there. I can't take it all in, Jesus! So don't just leave here sad having missed out on the many lessons she left us. Remember all the songs and tears, the great food and laughter, the hugs and holding hands.

Remember all the love. Swim in it.

Close your eyes and see her smile. Let it warm your spirit. Remember her laugh and where it comes from. Call up her voice and feel renewed.
