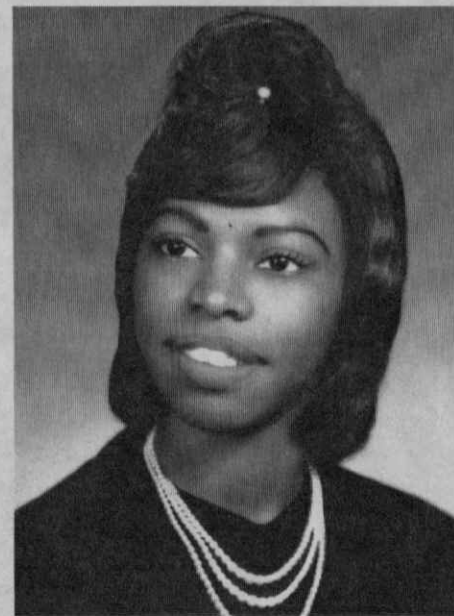

Dr. Gertrude Cain Ridgel Educator

Dr. Gertrude Cain Ridgel, born in Charleston, West Virginia on June 18, 1922, was the daughter of the late Aubrey J. and Teena Cain. Dr. Ridgel was a retired educator.

She graduated from West Virginia State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology and Mathematics. She received a Master of Philosophy degree with a major in Zoology; and later received a Doctor of Philosophy degree with a major in Genetics and Invertebrate Zoology from University of Wisconsin, Madison, Wisconsin.

She began her teaching career as an instructor of Biology at Tuskegee Institute in 1949. From there, she became an Assistant Professor of Biology at West Virginia State College from 1951-56.

On August 25, 1956 she was united in matrimony to Dr. Gus T. Ridgel.

From 1956 to 1958, Dr. Ridgel was Professor of Biology and Chairperson of the Division of Science and Mathematics at Albany State College. 1958 to 1960 she taught at Wiley College. In 1960 she joined the faculty at Kentucky State University. In 1972 she became Chairperson of the Biology Department. She went on to become Chairperson of Division of Science, Mathematics and Nursing and Professor of Biology. In 1983, Dr. Ridgel was named Dean, College of Arts and Sciences. She retired from Kentucky State University in 1986.

Throughout her lifetime, she received numerous honors and awards including Alumnae Of The Year, West Virginia State College in 1974; Kentucky Colonel; Board of Regents, Kentucky State University (Faculty Representative); Kentucky Academy of Science Board of Directors; National Advisory Council of Danforth Associates; Commission of Colleges for the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools; Citizen of the Year, Frankfort Alumnae Chapter of Delta

Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.; Professor Emeritus, Kentucky State University; Honorary Ph.D., Kentucky State University; Terese Lasser Award, American Cancer Society; Woman of the Year, Frankfort/Franklin County Branch of NAACP; and she was a Member of the Frankfort City Commission. Dr. Ridgel was listed as an Outstanding Educator of America in 1973 and 1975. She was listed in Who's Who in Kentucky in 1974

She has authored numerous publications and has been guest speaker for many occasions.

She was actively involved in many civic and social organizations. She was a member of The NAACP; The Franklin County Cancer Society; The Chums Bridge Club; a charter member of The Frankfort/Lexington Chapter of The Links, Incorporated; The Frankfort Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority.

Dr. Ridgel was actively involved in her church, 1st Baptist Church in Frankfort. She was a member of the Women's Missionary Union.

She leaves to cherish her memory a loving and devoted husband of 54 years, Dr. Gus T. Ridgel; a sister, Martha Swanson; a sister-in-law, Odera Pritchett; a brother-in-law, Herford Ridgel; a step-daughter, Betty Bolden; nieces Debra Green and Lenora King; a life long friend, Leola Madison Travis; and a host of other relatives, friends and former students.

Bishop Raymond Ross was born July 31, 1937 in Lexington, Kentucky. He was the son of the late Evangelist Goldie Saunders Ross Turner and Elder William H. Ross. On January 1, 1999 he was born into eternity.

He confessed a hope in Christ at an early age and became a faithful member of the Star of Bethlehem Church.

He was educated in the public schools of Lexington, Constitution Elementary and the old Dunbar High School. Other educational accomplishments are with Winona, International School of Professional Photography, School of Modern Photography, Pastoral Counseling, Rational Behavior, University of Kentucky College of Allied Health Professions and Asbury Theological Seminary.

In 1961 his radio career went into full swing as a Disc Jockey playing Gospel Music starting at WAXU, WNVL, WLAP F.M., and in 1964 he was the first black Weatherman in Lexington for Channel 62, now (Channel 36/Cable 10), for a month for vacationing Frank Faulkner. He was an Army Veteran ranked as a Supply Sergeant. Bishop Ross worked at the UK Medical Center for 31 years and retired as the Manager of Medical Photography Department. He is a member of the Professional Photographers of America, Past President of the Northside Lions Club and the Black Church Coalition. Bishop Ross is a Kentucky Colonel and a Board Member of African Cemetery #2.

By being faithful and always fond of working for the Lord, he was ordained as a Minister, Elder, Pastor and Bishop. He has pastored the Star of Bethlehem Church since 1966. In 1974, he was appointed Bishop of the Baptized Pentecostal Church of Holiness, Inc. He along with Bishop W.A.
