She was a loving sister, aunt, cousin and friend. Josephine's favorite song was "Go Tell it On The Mountains", a song she would sing every Christmas.




Early Sunday morning December 1, 1991 while getting ready to attend Sunday School and Church God saw fit to call another of His servants to reign in His kingdom.
