Obituary

There were flowers from Oprah Winfrey and Patti LaBelle, messages from Attorney General Janet Reno, Coretta Scott King and other civil rights leaders, tears, laughter and poetry at the funeral of Pulitzer Prize-winning photographer Moneta J. Sleet Jr. in the Unity Church of Christianity in the Long Island, NY, community of Valley Stream.

Hailed as one of the greatest photographers of the Freedom Movement and as a gentle giant with "a constant smile like a great flowing river," the Johnson Publishing Company photographer was celebrated in a simple and moving ceremony attended by friends, relatives and luminaries of the New York business, civic and media worlds, and an unusually large gathering of prize-winning photographers. Sleet, 70, was the first Black male and the first Black photographer to win a Pulitzer Prize. He died of cancer in New York's Columbia Presbyterian Hospital.

The principal mourners included Sleet's wife of 46 years, Juanita Harris Sleet; his daughter, Lisa; two sons, Gregory and Michael; a sister, Emmy Lou Wilson; and three grandchildren, Moneta Sleet III, Kelsi Marie Sleet and Ashley Evertsz. Gregory Sleet, the United States attorney for Delaware, expressed thanks on behalf of the family.

Tributes and reflections were offered by nephew Michael Harris, photographer Bertrand D. Miles, EBONY Executive Editor Lerone Bennett Jr., photographer and filmmaker Gordon Parks, and John H. Johnson, Johnson Publishing Company founder, chairman and CEO and Medal of Freedom recipient.

Harris said his uncle was a role model who influenced a whole generation of youths.

Johnson, who discovered Sleet when he purchased the assets of the defunct Our World magazine and who employed him for 41 years, said the photographer was a role model who influenced a whole generation of photographers. The publisher praised Sleet's Pulitzer Prize-winning photograph of Coretta Scott King and her daughter Bernice grieving at the

Martin Luther King, Jr. funeral as "perhaps the greatest photograph ever made of the grief of a widow." He added: "He was a man who could always be counted on not only to get the story but also to do the right thing."

Bennett, who worked with Sleet for 41 years, said "he was a major witness, perhaps the greatest witness, of our greatest 50 years....He was there, he had a camera and an eye, and he saw it all: Haile Selassie in his doomed glory, Kwame Nkrumah at the beginning of the African Revolution, Adam Clayton Powell Jr., Thurgood Marshall and Martin King at the beginning of the American Revolution, Fannie Lou Hamer in a Mississippi cottonfield, Rosa Parks on a Montgomery bus, Aretha Franklin demanding R-E-S-P-E-C-T. "Sleet was there. And in the end, the witness became the subject, the storyteller became the story, and the picture-taker became a picture and a promise and a truth."

Parks, who influenced Sleet and almost all Black photographers, recited a poem he wrote for the occasion: IN MEMORIAM (For Moneta Sleet), saying:

Your silence won't separate you from us,
nor from the hope you spawned--particularly
during those ungentle hours
when many black hearts seemed stripped of hope.
Best now that each of us attempt
to keep growing as you grew....

Parks concluded:

We owe you a fine remembrance, Moneta.

The principal eulogy was given by Sleet's childhood friend, the Rev. Dr. Norman M. Rates, professor of religion at Spelman College, who said that Sleet was a great photographer because he was a great person who saw not only with his eyes but also with his whole life. "While others of us see things through the naked eye," Dr. Rates said, "Sleet saw things through his soul." Citing Howard Thurman's celebrated phrase, "The Sound of the Genuine," the enlogist said that "Sleet was able to see the genuine in others because he was genuine." In the end, Dr. Rates concluded, the "gentle but firm" prophet from Owensboro, KY, immortalized himself in and through his photographs.

The photographer was buried at Calverton National Cemetery at Calverton, Long Island. The active pallbearers were Michael Harris, Ozier Muhammed, Thomas Sellers, Brady Speller, Charles Stewart, Fred Watkins and Kirk Williams. The honorary pallbearers were Jeanne Moutoussamy Ashe, Roy DeCarava, Christopher F. Edley Sr., Palmer Hamilton, Laura B. Randolph, Harvey Russell, Maurice Sorrell and G. Marshall Wilson.

Jack was a quiet and thoughtful person, never complaining about his own pains or ills. His admirable disposition enabled him to make and keep friends easily.

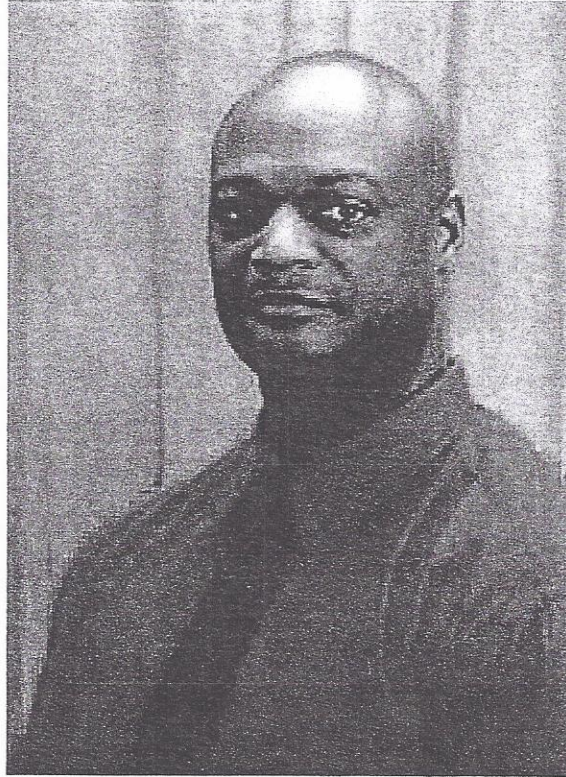
Jack spent his life in Boyle County and for the last seven years years he had been employed by General Electric in Louisville Ky.

Obituary

On Monday, September 6, 2010, Rev. Horace R. Smith, 82, pastor of the Pilgrim Baptist Church for 60 years and the Watkinsville Baptist Church for 50 years, was called by God from work to reward.

Rev. Smith was born in Georgetown, Kentucky as the seventh of eleven children born to Rev. Thomas H. and Sis. Helen E. Smith. He was converted and baptized at the Shiloh Baptist Church of Lexington under the pastorate of his father in 1936.

He was educated in the public schools of Lexington and graduated from the Paul Lawrence Dunbar High School. He attended Tuskegee Institute in Tuskegee, Alabama and Prairie View A & M in Prairie View, Texas.

Rev. Smith was united in Holy Matrimony on May 13, 1950 to the former Ethel Luvenia Hayes. To this union was born one son, Horace R. Smith, Jr.

In 1949, Rev. Smith acknowledged the call to preach the gospel and was licensed to preach on February 16, 1949. In November of 1949, Rev. Smith was called to the pastorate of the Pilgrim Baptist Church. Under Rev. Smith's stewardship, Pilgrim began to flourish numerically, materially, and most importantly, spiritually. Between 1953 and 1955 the church was remodeled and in 1957 the mortgage was burned. The church membership continued to grow and Pilgrim celebrated the completion of a new education facility in 1968 and a new sanctuary in 1970. The year of 2000 saw the modernization of the church building and the congregation observed the completion of a new Fellowship Hall in 2001.

During Rev. Smith's pastorate, the missionary reach of the Pilgrim Baptist Church extended far into the community. Pilgrim has been recognized several times over the years for building a distribution center for God's Pantry, a food bank serving those in need. Other outreach programs instituted at Pilgrim under Rev. Smith's leadership include a tutoring service for students, mentoring programs for youth, a prescription drug assistance program and quarterly programs and activities with Eastern State Hospital patients. Rev. Smith also initiated scholarship programs for students who continue their education beyond high school and an academic recognition program to encourage elementary and secondary school students. Pilgrim's focus on academics included establishing the Lexington's first adult education program for the blind.

In June 1960, Rev. Smith accepted the call to pastor the Watkinsville Baptist Church of Scott County. For 50 years, Rev. Smith faithfully drove to rural Scott County on each second and fourth Sunday to serve the spiritual needs of this congregation. During Rev. Smith's pastorate, the Watkinsville Baptist Church renovated the sanctuary, added a fellowship hall, a choir room and pastor's study. The church also hosted numerous district meetings. Despite a dwindling membership, Watkinsville Baptist Church remained a spiritual beacon in the community under Rev. Smith's spiritual guidance.

Rev. Smith served as treasurer of the Howard's Creek District Convention for 42 years. He also served the last 10 years as the Howard's Creek District Convention Dean of Instruction. For 29 years, Rev. Smith served as a member and then Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Simmons University. Upon his retirement from the board he was named Chairman Emeritus. Rev. Smith also served as Vice-Moderator of the Ministers and Deacons Meeting of Lexington and Vicinity.

Rev. Smith is survived by his wife of 60 years, Ethel L. Hayes Smith; a son, Horace R. Smith, Jr. (Jennifer); two grandsons, Thomas H. Smith, IV and Chandler J. Smith; a sister, Kathryn Smith Stephens, two brothers, William H. (Virginia) Smith and Rev. Charles H. (Kimanne) Smith and a host of nieces, nephews, family and friends. He was preceded in death by his parents, Rev. Thomas H. and Mrs. Helen E. Smith and siblings, Thomas H. Smith, Jr., Carter Omega Smith, Miss Rose Smith, Mrs. Mary Smith Simpson Matthews, Mrs. Minnie Smith Hall, Dr. John T. Smith, and Rev. Gloster M. Smith.

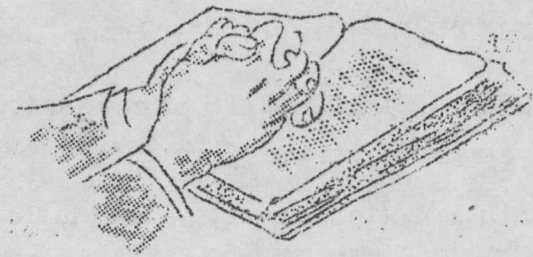

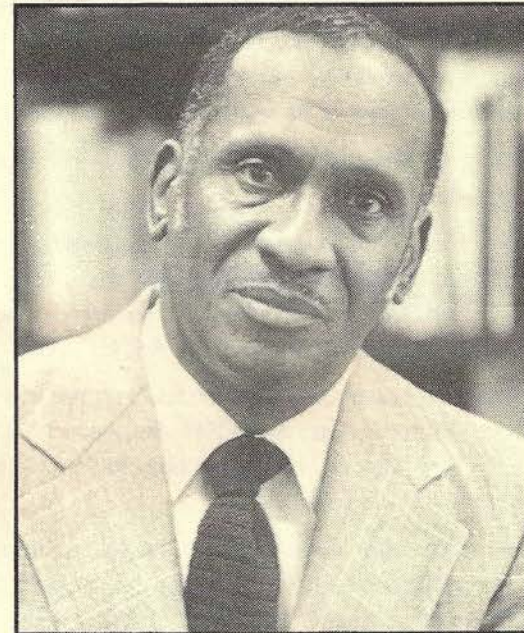

Obituary

DR. JOHN T. SMITH was born in Lexington, Kentucky, the son of the late Rev. Thomas H. Smith and Helena Ray Smith. He was graduated from the old Dunbar High School in 1936 and attended Kentucky State University from which he received a baccalaureate degree in English in 1940. He entered graduate school at Indiana University in the Fall of 1940. His graduate education was interrupted by World War II and he served in the 689th Signal Air Warning Company attached to the 13th Air Force for three years. In the Summer of 1946 he returned to the graduate school at I.U. where he completed the equivalency of a M.A. in English Literature.

Dr. Smith's teaching career was begun at Dunbar Junior-Senior High School in Lexington, Kentucky in Fall of 1946, and he taught there until 1954 when he was appointed Assistant Principal of the school, a position he held until he resigned in 1959 to enter the University of Kentucky as a full-time doctoral student. He received his doctorate in 1961 and was the first black student to be awarded the doctorate from UK.

From August 1961 until 1965, Dr. Smith served as Principal of Constitution Elementary School in Lexington, KY.

During the summer of 1965, he taught two graduate classes in the College of Education at UK. In the Fall of 1965, he moved to Ashland, Kentucky, where he taught Psychology and Education at the Ashland Community College. He also served as Chairman of the Division of Behavioral Sciences and Chairman of the A.C.C. faculty.

In 1968 he was appointed Assistant Director of the newly opened Jefferson Community College in Louisville, Kentucky. On July 1, 1969, he assumed the duties of Chief Administrator of J.C.C., a position he held until he came back to the main campus of UK in 1975 as Vice President of Minority Affairs.

During a long and active career as an educator, Dr. Smith was recognized with citations and awards far too numerous to be listed here. One among many of which he was justifiably proud was the naming of the "John T. Smith Learning Center" on the downtown campus of J.C.C. in 1985. He was also quite pleased to have been named as one of four "Teachers of Renown" by the Fayette County School System in 1986.

Although retired from the field of education, Dr. Smith was very active in educational and civic affairs.

Dr. Smith, a widower, was the father of three children, Thomas H. Smith III, a LexMark employee, Ethelda Estelle, a computer programmer at UK, and Nathaniel DePratt, a real estate appraiser in Charlottesville, Virginia. Dr. Smith is also survived by brothers, Rev. G. M. (Mattie), Rev. H. R. (Ethel), William (Virginia), Rev. C. H. (Kim) and sisters, Minnie S. Hall and Kathryn S. Stephens, mother-in-law, Estelle Fleming and brother-in-law, James N. Fleming (Verna) and a host of other relatives and friends.

McCarley Smith was born on Wednesday, November 27, 1940 in Clark County Kentucky to the late Ollie Watkins and the late George Smith.

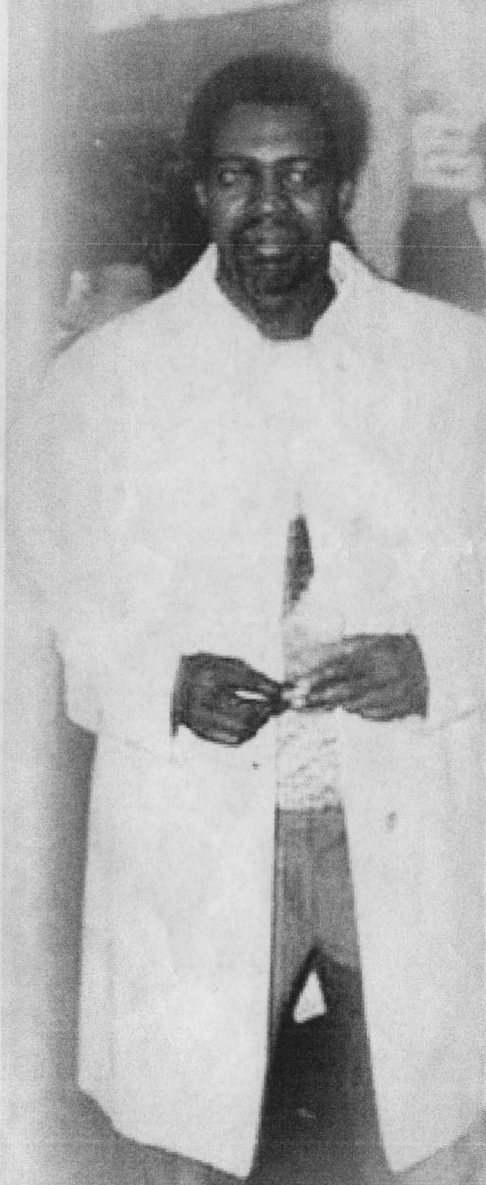

Their recognition of each of us as individuals within the family has been a decisive influence in our being able to accord this same recognition to those with whom we work in our respective fields of endeavor. If we, as their offspring, are able to make any contribution to the improvement of this world in which we live, it is the direct result of those principles which they strove to instill in us by precept and example.

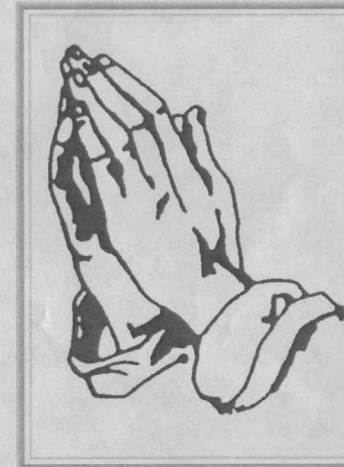
