Obituary Mary Wade Warren

Mary Wade Warren was the second of eight children, and the oldest daughter born to loving parents, Charles and Anna Wade. She made her entranced into the world in 1915 in Harrodsburg, Kentucky. Life among her many siblings created many warm memories during her early years.

Mary accepted Christ at a young age; she was baptized in Perrysburg, Kentucky. Her love of Christ was expressed through many years of devoted service. Her aptitude for figures and her zeal for church initiatives continued as late as 2005. It was not until then that she relinquished her post as Secretary of the Building Fund for First Baptist Church, in Frankfort, Kentucky.

Mary had a dream, and the fortitude to make her ambitions a realization. After graduation from West Side School in 1952, she enrolled in Kentucky State College. She obtained her Bachelor's Degree in History and Government, but was, also, insightful enough to do the necessary additional coursework for an Elementary Teaching certificate

One year later, she accepted the challenge presented by yet another one room school in Taylor County, near Campbellsville, in both instances; Mary was responsible for grades one through eight. She humorously commented to some that she literally worked herself to death in her first three years of teaching. On the contrary, her brilliant career covered forty-two years. It was spearheaded with on-going enthusiasm and energized by a sense of mission.

Mary took great pride in her students' accomplishments. When she began teaching, the local Board of Education administered a comprehensive eight grade examination. Passage of this test was necessary for certification completion of eighth grade. Mary was "pleased as punch" to report that her students rarely failed this examination.

Mary had career roots in Harrodsburg, also, at her former school, West Side School. Additionally she taught in Richmond, Kentucky and Lexington, Kentucky. In 1965, she was employed in Franklin County where she taught at Elkhorn Elementary and Elkhorn Middle School until her well-earned retirement in 1980. What an illuminous flame she bore, for her students, kindergarten to grade eight, decade after decade – a flame created by a dedicated professional with a love for students, for learning and for the artistry of her craft. In 1936, Mary married Mark Warren. This beautiful marriage lasted sixty years until her husband's passing in 1996. Mary and Mark were blessed with an only son, Mark III. Mary happily committed to her son's early growth and development as full-time mother. She resumed her career in the early forties.

Mark, now deceased was the love of their lives, "Buddy", as he was fondly called was an Emmy Award winning television director. "Laugh In" was the showcase for his extraordinary talent. He graced Mary with seven delightful grandchildren, and subsequently, she even became a great-grandmother. The families reside in California.

Mary was truly faithful alumnae of Kentucky State College. Every year at homecoming, she was known to host a gala party, complete with many of the family favorites. The party was an annual event enjoyed by fellow alumni.

One could say, without a doubt, that she was set in her ways as evidenced by her self-satisfying use of a wringer washer despite all the modern wonders of technology in the twenty first century. Surely, we remember her as an entrepreneur at a very early age. You name it! She could design it, fix it and make it. Perhaps she could have been an earlier version of Martha Stewart.

Mary was preceded death by her husband, Mark Warren: son, Mark Warren III; sisters, Margaret Wade Williams and Fannie Wade Barlow; brothers, Charles Wade, Ernest Wade, and Bennie Wade.

During Mary's declining years, she was blessed to have constant and devoted care by her beloved nephew, Ronnie Wade and niece, Wanda Wade. 
