She accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior at the age of eleven at Bethel A.M.E. Church in Adrian, Michigan, under the pastoral leadership of her father.

Etolia was educated in the Detroit Public School System where she attended Northwestern High School, graduating on June 17, 1959. She received her formal education at Kentucky State University in Frankfort, KY where she earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Sociology in 1970 and a Master of Public Administration degree, specializing in Human Resource Management and International Administration and Development in 1997. She also attended the Federal Aviation Administration Aeronautical Academy in Oklahoma City, OK where she was certified as an Air Traffic Control Specialist.

In November 2005, Reverend White was licensed to preach; subsequently, in August 2008, she was formally ordained by The Right Reverend Vashti Murphy McKenzie, first female Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. She worked diligently in the church in many capacities, throughout her life, in various cities.

Etolia's life was spent advocating for poor, disadvantaged, downtrodden, and disenfranchised people. This was evidenced through her work on the local, state, and federal levels which included serving as: Equal Opportunity Specialist, Contract Compliance Specialist, Federal Women's Program Coordinator, Director of the Disability Resource Center at Kentucky State University, and as Executive Director of the Crime Victims Assistance Program (CVAP) for Franklin County in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. She also served as a foster parent, Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA), Hospice of the Bluegrass Volunteer, and Public Advocacy worker.

She was a lifetime member of the Kentucky State University National Alumni Association; a Governor appointee of the Kentucky Library Association Advisory Board, Director of Christian Education at St. John A.M.E. Church in Frankfort, KY, Safe Place Advisory Board member, and served on numerous other boards and auxiliaries during her lifetime.

Reverend White began chronicling her life in a manuscript she entitled, "Coming Through the Storms." Her daughter, Natasha, has plans to complete her mother's memoir.

Reverend White was preceded in death by her parents, William and Gladys White siblings, George, Leotha, Frank, Gerald, and Gloria White. She leaves to cherish her memory, her only child, to whom she was devoted and loved dearly, her daughter - Natasha Yvonne Brown-McGhee (Jason), her family's matriarch, Mary B. Tull of Chattanooga, TN, a host of nieces, nephews, relatives, godchildren, and the AME Church at large.




When Tomorrow Starts Without Me
