A Glimpse of the Life of Elder Sherman A. Williams, I

Sherman Anthony Williams, I, was born to Shirley Williams and Marie White Williams on May 5, 1958, in Marion County, Lebanon, Kentucky. He was welcomed into a house where he already had four sisters. Later, two more sisters arrived.

Sherman was educated in Lebanon. He was a very good student and participated in track, football and band. As a youngster, Sherman attended Sherman Chapel AME Church. At the age of twelve, he was baptized in Jesus' name by the late Dr. William P. Foree, and received the Holy Ghost shortly thereafter. Sherman felt the Lord was calling him to the ministry at age twelve, but he did not fully accept this calling until he turned 21. Sherman was a very dedicated young man who was faithful to the church and did whatever his hands could find to do for the Lord. Evang. Josephine Knuckles ("Mama Jo") and Eld. Cleotus McElroy were two of the saints in the church who encouraged Sherman in his adolescence.

Sherman moved to Bowling Green, KY, in 1976 to attend Western Kentucky University ("WKU"). While there, he attended Our Lord's Temple under the pastorate of the late Eld. Preston T. Satterfield. Sherman worked diligently to help the church. He directed the choir, transported people and preached his first sermon there.

In 1978, Sherman met Andrea Myers at a council. They became fast friends and began to date. They married on August 4, 1979, and to this union were born three daughters and two sons. They are: twins, Sher'he and Sherman, II, 19, Seleste, 18, Sheriden, 17, and Stephanie, 15.

Sherman continued in school and supported his growing family. He was the first black male to graduate having completed the two-year nursing program at WKU. At one point, while living in Louisville and attending Newburg Apostolic Church, he headed the Evangelistic Team there.

Sherman always had a strong desire to serve on state and national levels in the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World, Inc. ("PAW"). He was elected Vice President of the Kentucky and Tennessee Pentecostal Young People's Union and served from 1982-86 and was elected President in 1986 and served until 1991.

In 1989, feeling a very strong desire to pastor and a wrenching grief for his mentor (Dr. W. P. Foree), he began a work in Paducah, KY. Sherman's family had never seen him work so hard in his young life.

In April, 1991, a tumor was discovered in his brain. Sherman underwent surgery and was given 3-12 months to live. At that time, the influence that he had ever had on the lives of others became apparent. People from many states, cities, and denominations that he had become acquainted with came to support him and his family. It was a time for him to receive some of the love that he so freely gave. The Lord blessed Sherman to fully recover.

While in Paducah, after his surgery, Sherman was a student at Mid-Continent Bible College until the Lord directed the Williams family back to Louisville where Sherman continued to serve earnestly in the church. He was willing to aid Suff Bishop Stewart (pastor) and Eld. Henry Jones (asst. pastor) in whatever capacity they needed him to fulfill.

Sherman enrolled at WKU to pursue his Bachelor's degree in Nursing commuting weekly (first from Paducah, then from Louisville), and graduated cum laude in 1996. Sherman continued to pursue his education and enrolled as a parttime student in Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in pursuit of a Master's degree.

In January, 1999, Sherman's brain tumor reoccurred. He fought it with everything that was in him, keeping the faith and finishing his course.

His mother and father preceded him in death. He leaves to mourn his absence. but rejoice in his salvation and cherish his memories, his devoted wife, Andrea, three daughters, Sher'he, Seleste, and Stephanie Williams, and two sons. Sherman, II, and Sheriden Williams; nine sisters, Mrs. Mary Furman (Joe). 
Tommy was a graduate of Boyle Co. High School. His great passion in life was his music and graphic arts. To meet him you realized he had a spirit of entrepreneurship.
