I recently attended the funeral of a fellow veteran's wife. During the ceremony I was reminded of the many sacrifices that military wives are required to make in support of their husband's chosen careers.

Most of us who have earned the title of veteran wear it proudly. Those who have earned the title of military wife should be shown the same respect, admiration, and gratitude.


They also serve - those who watch and wait.
